I am sure many of you will have watched the moving Coronation Service and processions on the morning of Saturday, 6 May. In the evening residents were able to celebrate this wonderful day at the Coronation Dance held in the Community Centre that ended with a 'Last Night of the Proms Finale' where those present could join in singing a rousing rendition of patriotic songs.

Sunday, 7 May was a beautiful sunny day so that all residents could enjoy the street party organised by the Eccelian and The Royal Oak. A fantastic line up of acts that included Jo Safina and Peetloaf performing as Meatloaf, Andy James as Elvis, the sensational Jersey Boys tribute act, Stone Cold Crazy and Abba Express entertained the huge numbers of people who attended. The activities for children were much appreciated and included various bouncy castles, face painting and a bubble show. Saturday 1st July saw the sixth Well Dressing Festival held in Croxton. It is the most westerly Well Dressing to take place in England, and is a real village affair with so many people of all ages and all parts of the community getting involved in this wonderful countryside tradition.

The exact origins of well dressing have been lost over time, but it's thought that the custom may have found its start in a pagan ritual of leaving gifts thanking the local water gods for the continued supply of fresh water. What started out as being a simple offering of flowers grew more elaborate when the custom was revived by the Victorians and well dressings were created depicting popular stories from the Bible. These days, the subject matter has diversified a bit. The well dressings at Croxton have a different theme every two years, with the history of local place names, the Coronation and other water-based themes being illustrated in 2023.

The heavy wooden frames are left to soak in the River Sow for two weeks so that when they are filled with clay, the wood doesn't absorb the moisture from the clay and the designs last longer. The clay boards are then decorated with natural objects including dried alder knobs, coffee beans, seeds, egg shell, dried banana skins, and, most importantly, flower petals which give the pictures their colour and detail. This creates a beautiful mosaic picture.

Some materials such as petals require a certain way of laying (like tiles on a roof) to ensure they stay put and can withstand the weather.

The designs were created by 35 ladies who thoroughly enjoyed the team work and skills of this ancient art. Some were old-hands, others novices and many found it addictive. All were delighted with the end results.

Early on the Saturday morning the completed Well Dressings were loaded onto a trailer and towed up from Blorepipe to Croxton by Rob Unsworth's bright red tractor. Then a team of strong men erected the heavy clay boards into place by the wells and ponds along a half-mile trail through Croxton.

At 11.30am, crowds gathered on 'The Flash' in front the old village Well in the centre of Croxton, - known as Boughey's Well. Mrs Beryl Roe (a long-standing member of Croxton community) officially opened the Festival, and Rev. Sara Humphries and Father David conducted a traditional 'Blessing of the Well'. Ros Langford (Croxton Well Dressing Festival Co-ordinator) thanked Stafford Borough Council, Eccleshall Parish Council and James du Pavey for the funding support they

had given to the event, and to the planning committee who had worked so hard to make the event possible.

Visitors could then walk the Wells Trail to view the designs or visit the stalls and displays by local community groups in the Millennium Wood. There were also delicious bacon butties available for brunch, and folk music played by the Tern Valley Tinkers.

Around 1pm people made their way down to St Paul's Church for tea and cakes followed by a poetry and music concert. The variety and quality of local music talent that was showcased delighted the audience as did the poetry, some of which had been especially written for the event.


The Well Dressings were displayed for 7 days, and hopefully there will be another event in 2025.
