Jonathan Eades then introduced the Bishop of Stafford who conducted the traditional blessing of the well, and the Church choir, accompanied by Ellen Butter on her guitar, led everyone in singing two hymns. Ros Langford thanked everyone for coming and hoped they would walk the Croxton wells trail to see all 5 of the well dressings, visit the stalls and displays in the Millennium Wood and then go down to St Paul's Church for the afternoon music and poetry concert. Everyone had a wonderful time and the concert was the best yet. Thanks to all those people who have helped in anyway - it has involved many people over many months, but the end result was worth it. The well dressings remained on display for a week, and were added to mid week with some smaller well dressings created by the Faraday Road Stafford Stroke Club with the help of Carol Benbow and Ros. #### **BUS SERVICES**

The Parish Council is disappointed that it was not made aware of the proposed changes to the services and did not have the opportunity to provide any input into the revisions made.



Subsequent discussions with the provider and Staffordshire County Council secured a visit from D & G Buses to Eccleshall to give advice and information regarding the upcoming service changes. Hopefully the visit, expected to have taken place on September 3rd, 2015 was well advertised and members of the public were able to go along to collect leaflets and timetable booklets.

Members of the Parish Council are also hoping to arrange a meeting with the operators and representatives of Staffordshire County Council very shortly to ascertain whether some of the concerns raised locally can be addressed.

#### NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

The six week consultation period undertaken by Stafford Borough Council ended on July 13th, 2015. All the responses received have now been collated by the Borough Council and submitted to the appointed examiner, Mr Nigel McGurk. The Neighbourhood Plan together with all the submitted documents is currently undergoing examination.

Following the examination, Mr McGurk will prepare a report and recommend whether the Plan can be referred to a public referendum. The Borough Council must then consider the Examiner's report and make a decision on whether to refer the Plan to public referendum or to refuse the Plan.

If the plan is recommended for public referendum, the Borough Council will make the necessary arrangements and it is likely that a referendum will be held early in 2016. If more than 50% of the votes at the referendum are in favour of the Plan it will form part of Stafford Borough's local development plan for the Parish of Eccleshall.

The Parish Council has submitted strong objections to two planning applications for development off Cross Butts and Green Lane, which have been submitted recently involving land outside the Settlement Boundary identified in the emerging Neighbourhood Plan. Objections included the fact that the developments constituted an unnecessary expansion of Eccleshall as the Neighbourhood Plan identifies sufficient land for development to comply with The Plan for Stafford Borough.

#### FOOTPATH MARSHALLS

Some years ago a scheme was established whereby volunteers agreed to adopt various footpaths in the Parish and walk them a couple of times per year. Reporting any problems to the Parish Council Clerk so that the Parish Council handyman could carry out any maintenance required - erect or repair stiles gates and fingerposts and remove vegetation. Larger jobs are referred to the Rights of Way Officer to be addressed or issues with Landowners resolved

There are 143 paths in Eccleshall Parish and over the years the system developed in Eccleshall, which was instigated by John Allen, became an example of good practice.

Following John's retirement earlier this year it has become evident that some of the volunteers have moved on or no longer wish to be involved in the scheme. In July, Councillor Paul Mullee

was elected as Chairman of the Footpaths Committee and it was agreed to try to resurrect the Marshalling scheme.

#### COMMUNITY ACTION
